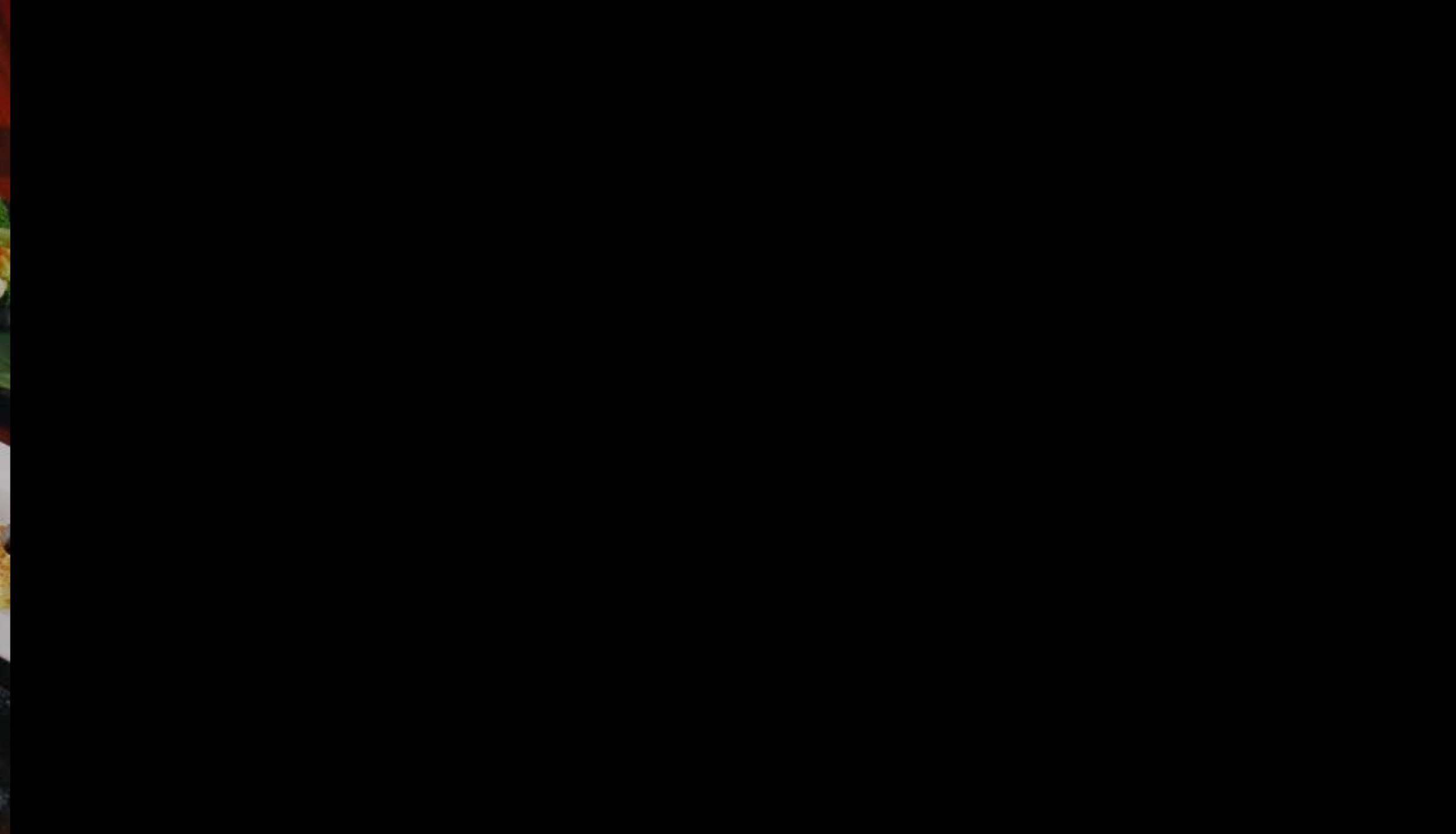

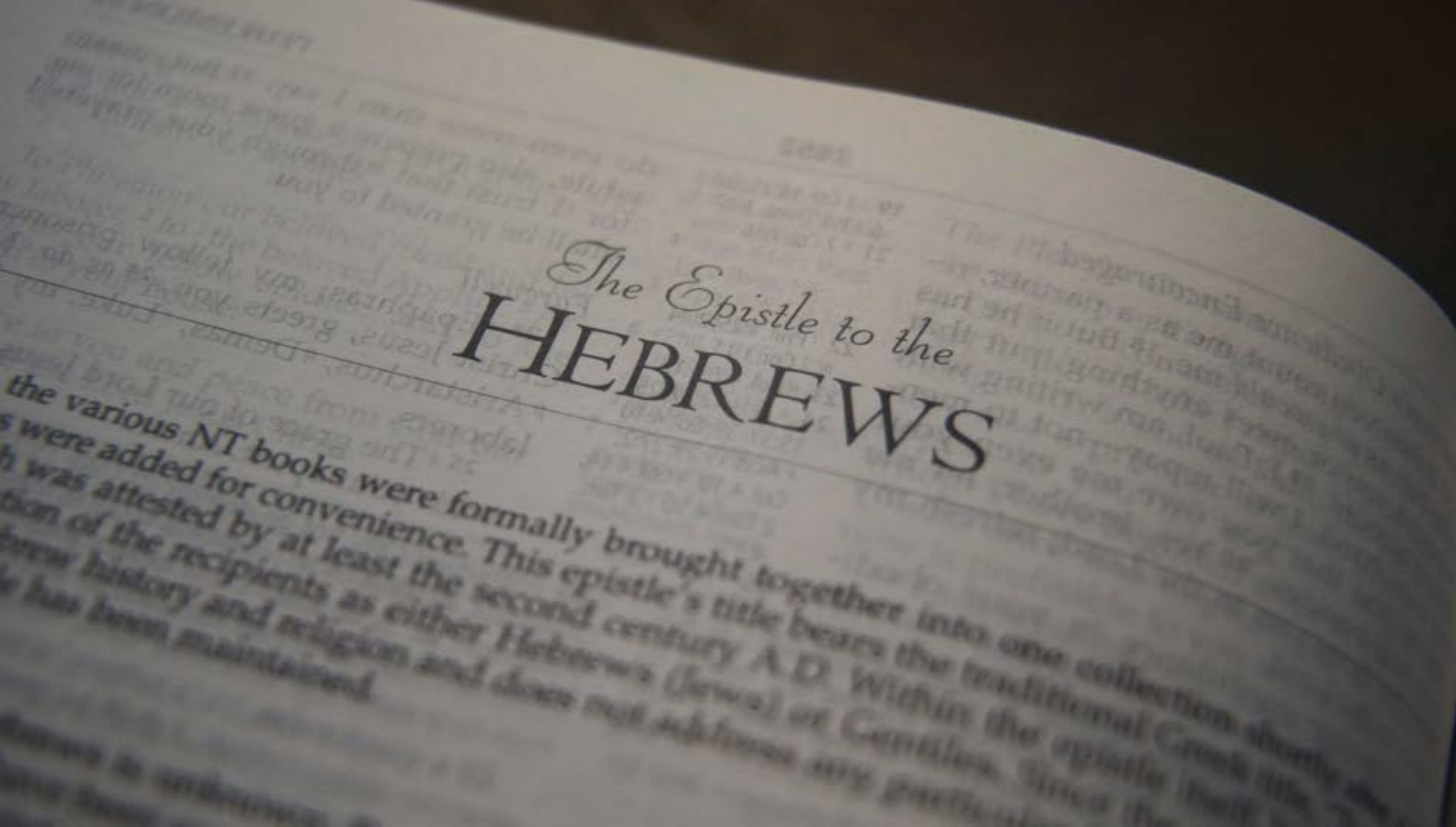






The Epistle to the
