Healthy submission is an act that is expressed mutually, voluntarily, humbly, and out of desire to serve, bless, and help others.

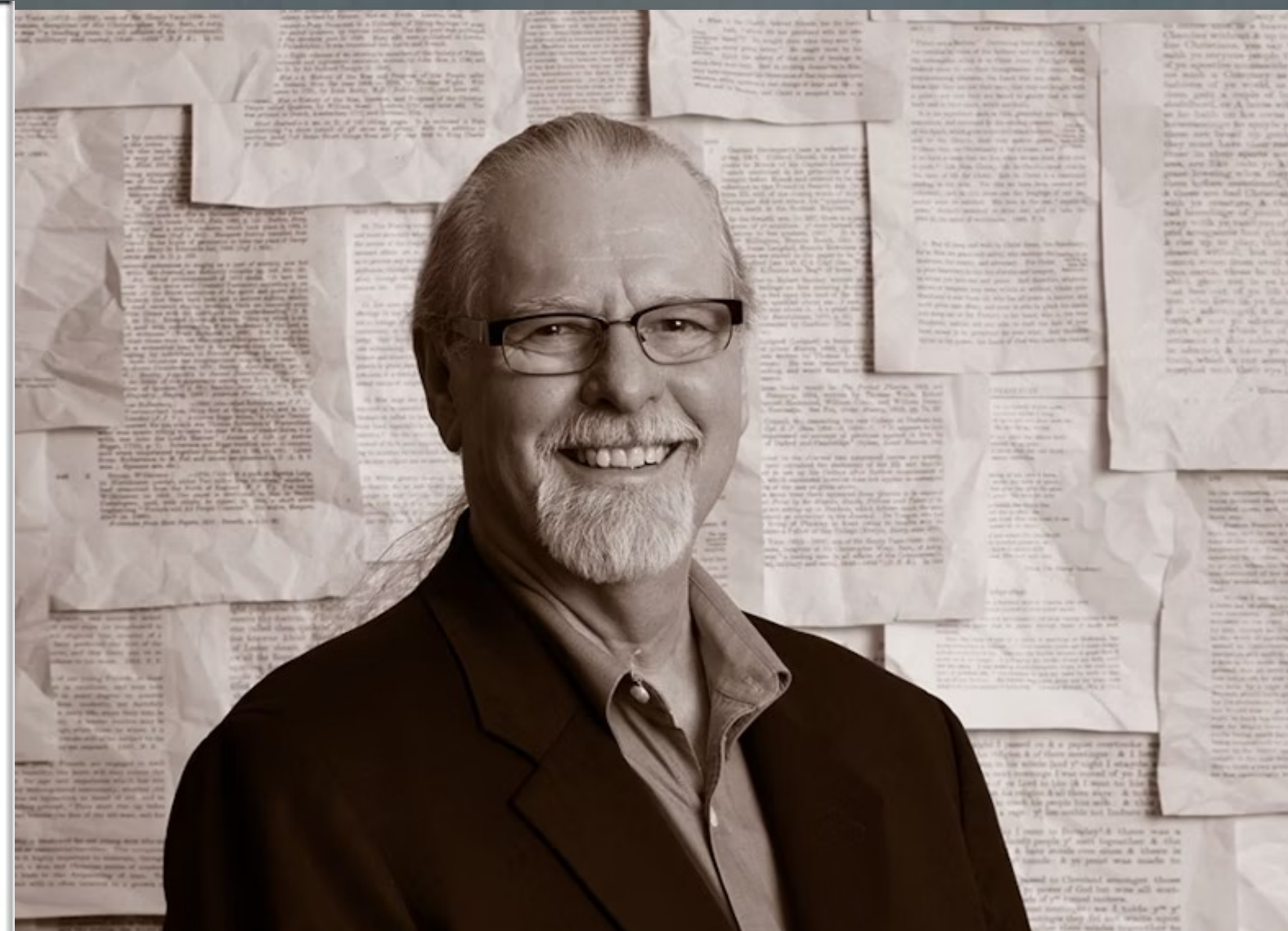
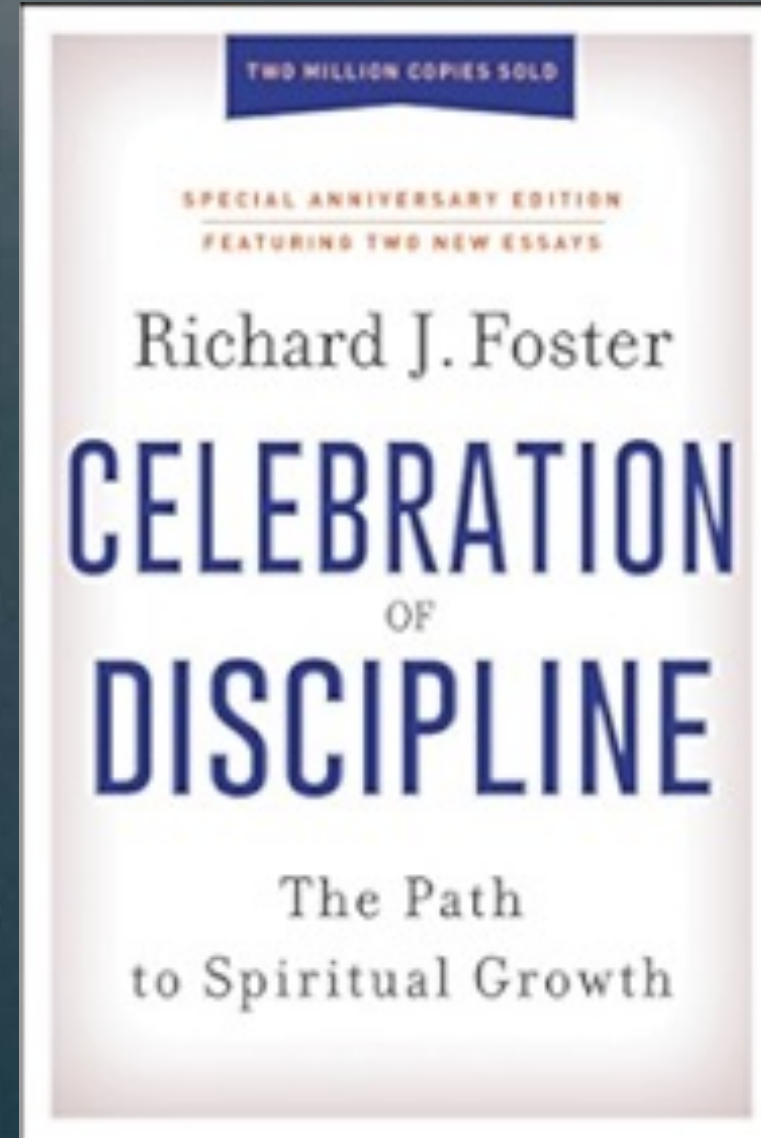
This is true in all Christian relationships.

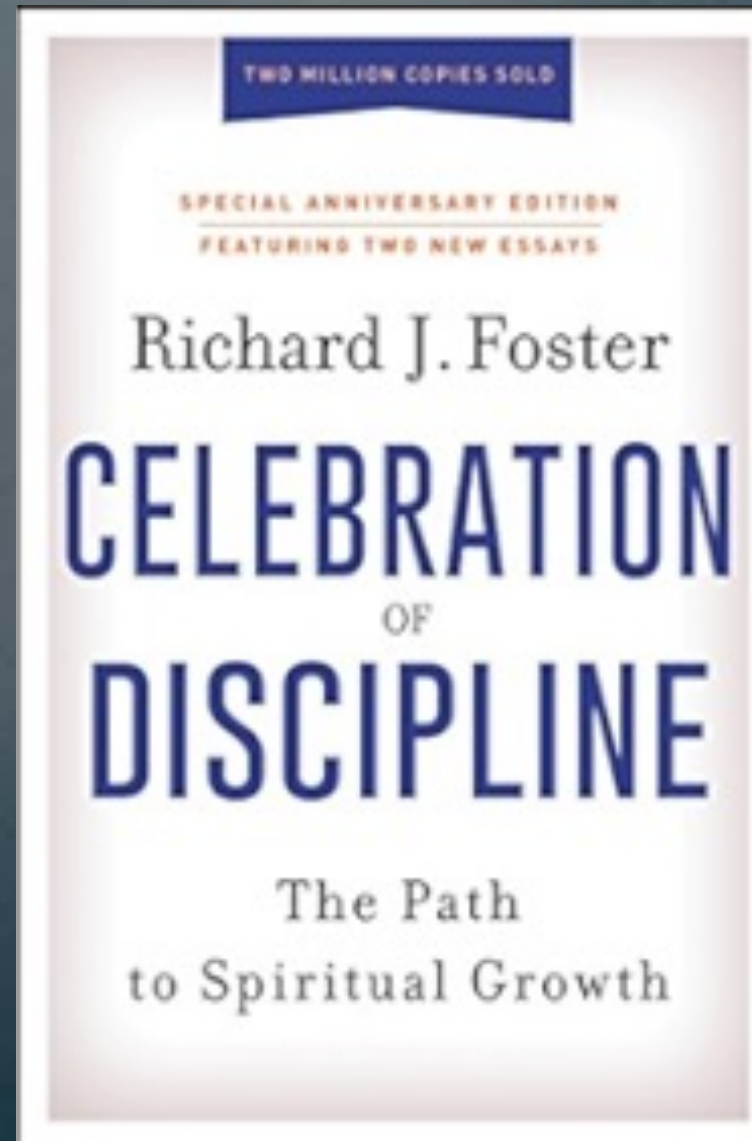

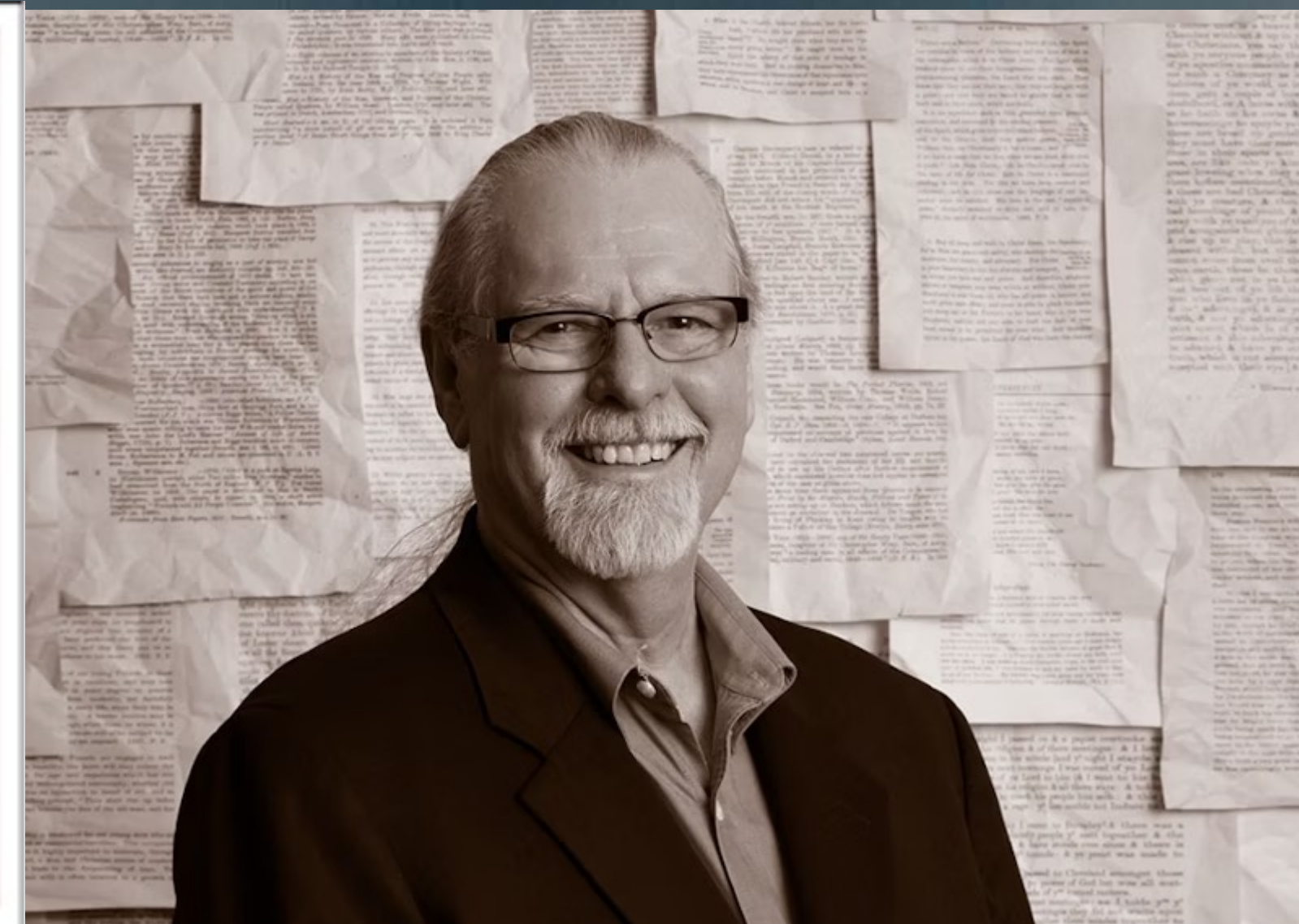
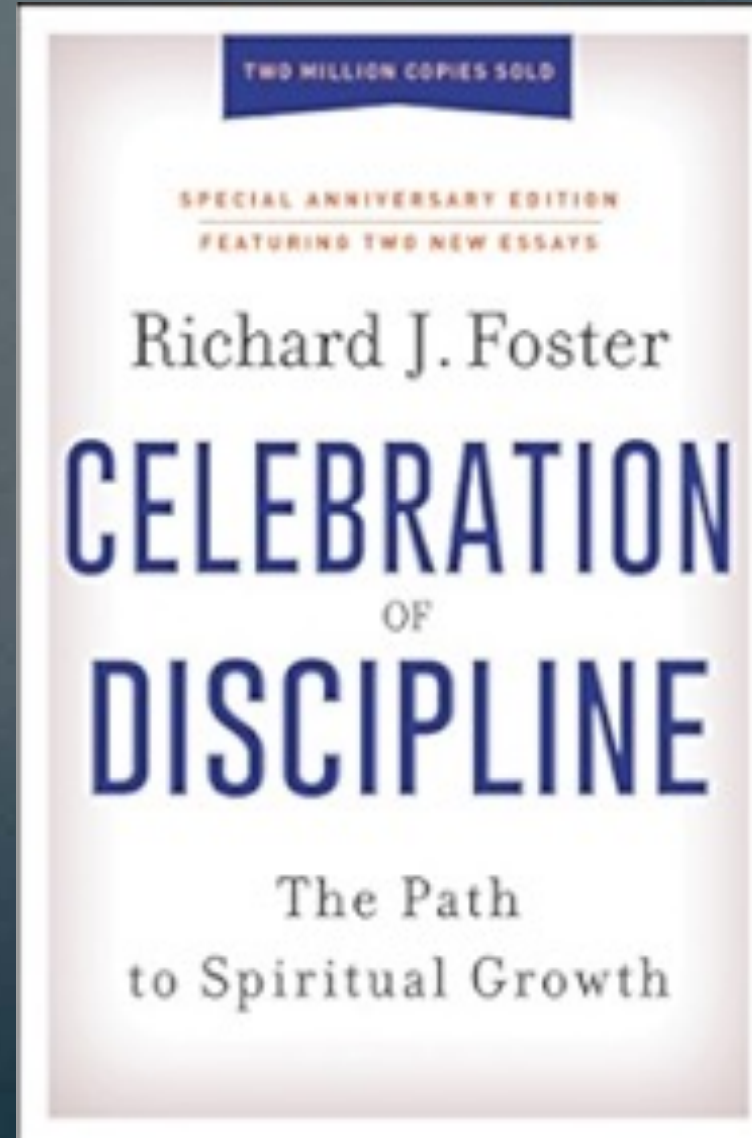

What is Submission?





“People will spend weeks, months, even years in a perpetual stew because some little thing did not go as they wished. They will fuss and fume. They will get mad about it. They will act as if their very life hangs on the issue. They may even get an ulcer over it. In the Discipline of submission, we are released to drop the matter, to forget it. Frankly, most things in life are not nearly as important as we think they are. Our lives will not come to an end if this or that does not happen.”



“If you watch these things you will see that almost all church fights and splits occur because people do not have the freedom to give in to each other.

*We insist that a critical issue is at stake; we are fighting for a sacred principle. Perhaps this is the case. **Usually it is not.** Often we cannot stand to give in simply because it means we will not get our own way.*

Only in submission are we enabled to bring this spirit to a place where it no longer controls us. Only submission can free us sufficiently to enable us to distinguish between genuine issues and stubborn self-will.”


Limits to submission
