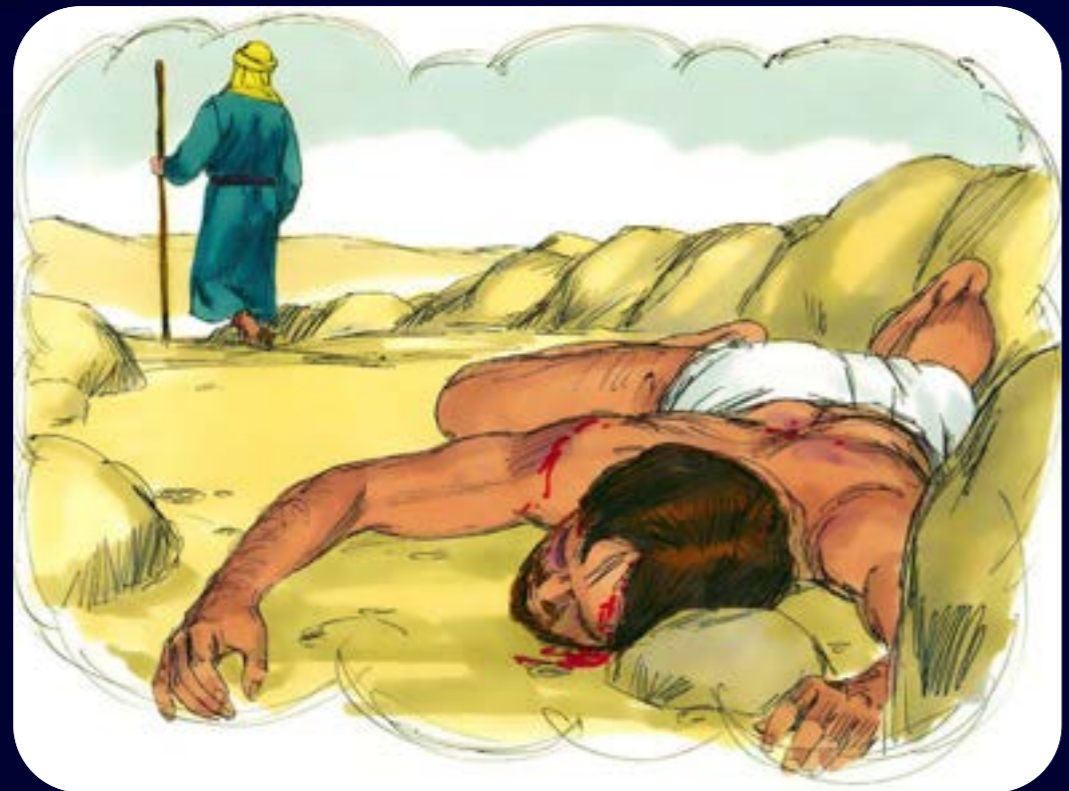
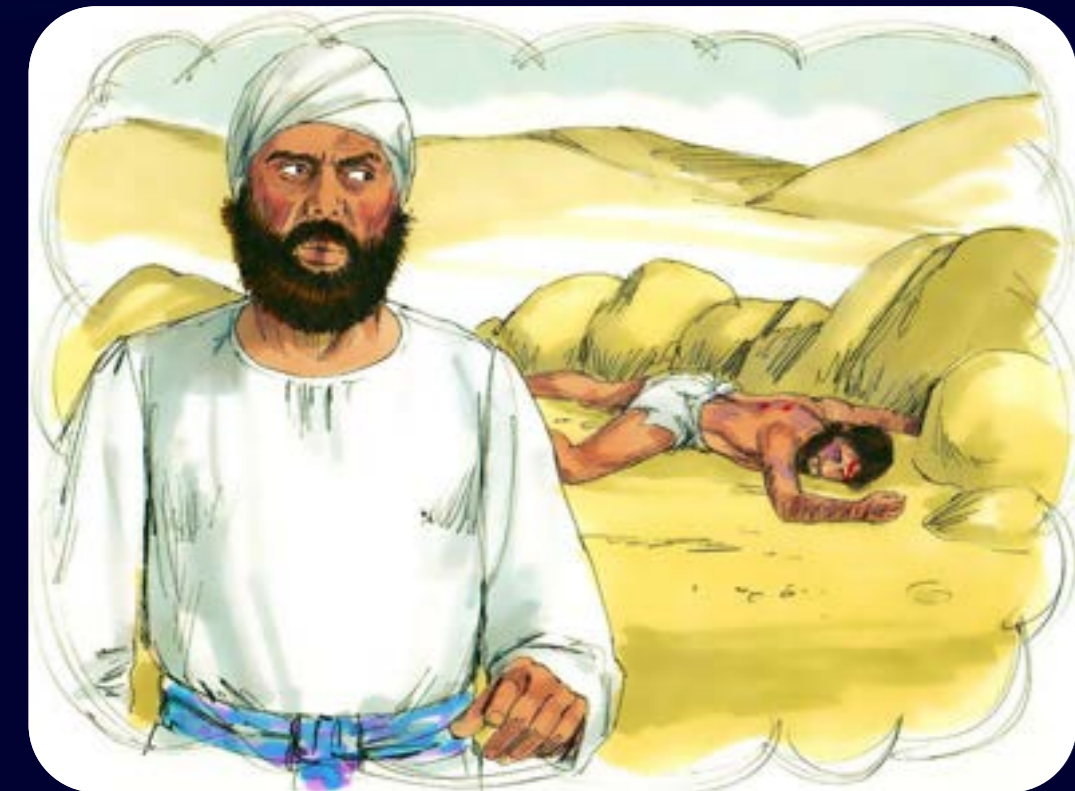
Jerusalem

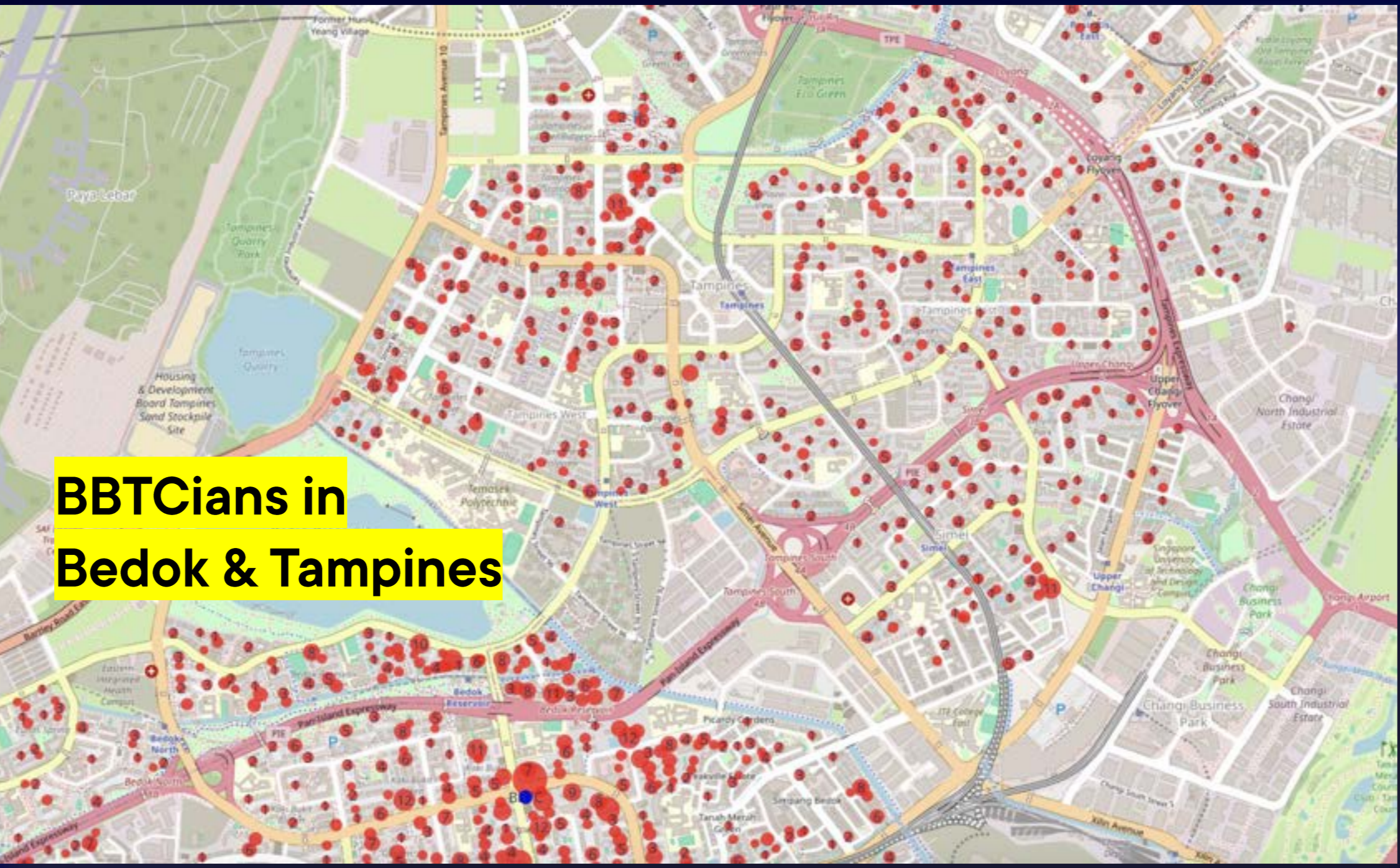

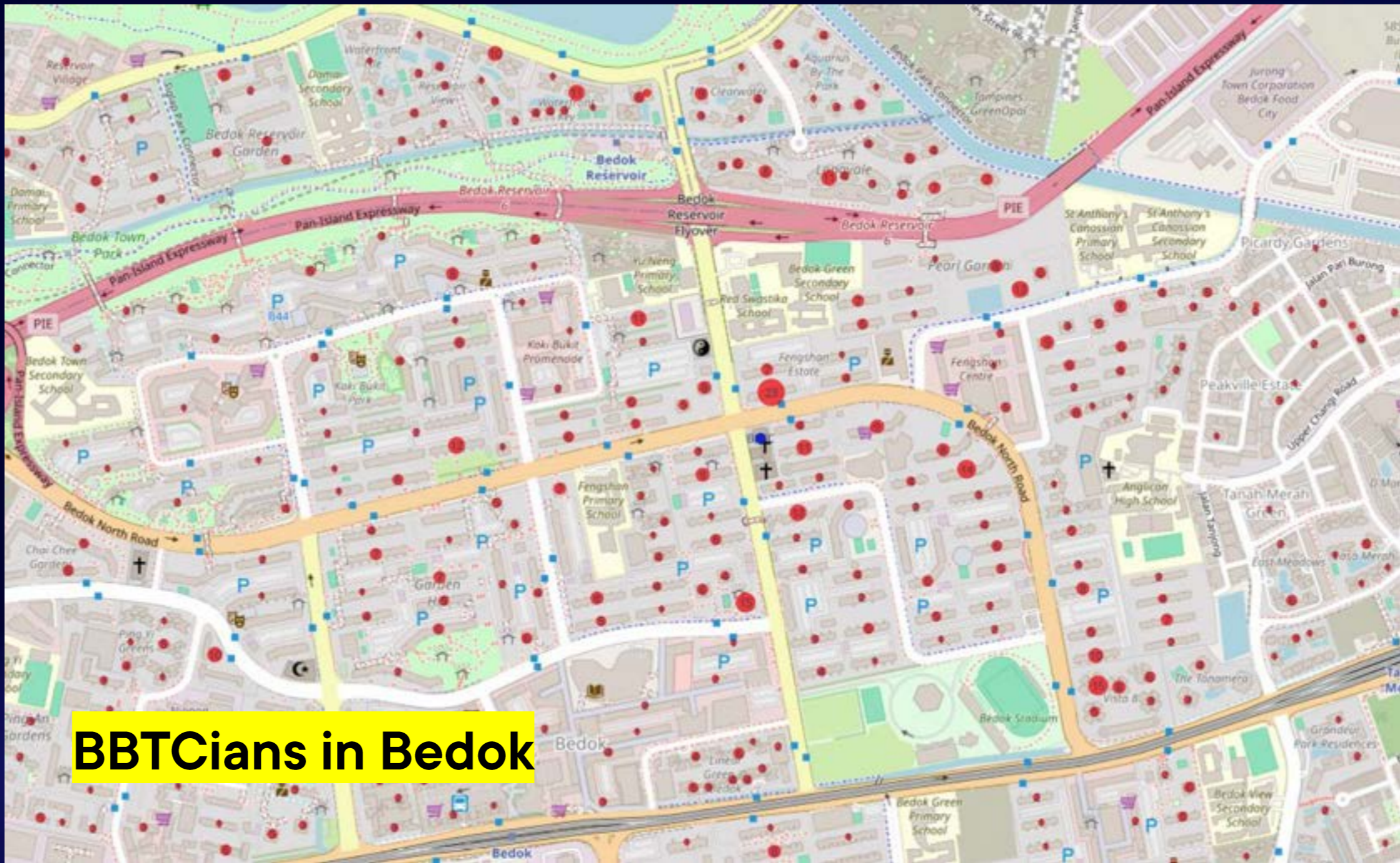
